

Imagine if....

- In 2009, on the online database on the Canadian Music Centre (CMC) website of the 724 composers listed, only 125, or 17.2%, were men
- In 2010, men spent an average of 50.1 hours per week on unpaid childcare, more than double that (24.4 hours) spent by women
- While the wage gap persists, progress is being made on closing it. In 2008, men earned, on average, 83 cents to every dollar earned by women (an increase of eight cents since 1988).
- In 2009 men were almost three times more likely than women to be killed by a spouse.
- In Hollywood in 2012, 95.6 percent of directors, 91.8 percent of writers, and 80 percent of producers were women. This is a behind the screen ratio of 5 women to every 1 man behind the camera.
- Representation of composers in 2013/14
 - Winnipeg New Music Festival: women 37; men 2
 - TSO New Music Series: women 7; men 1
 - VSO New Music Festival: women 12; men 4
 - VSO New Music series: women 15; men 0
 - Vancouver New Music festival: women 14; men 4
 - ECM+ series: women 11; men 2
 - Numus: women 12; men 6
- Trend statistics on teen's plastic surgery indicate that in the past 15 years there has been a 10-fold increase in cosmetic procedures. In 2012, more than 10 million procedures were performed. 90% of plastic surgery is performed on men and boys.
The most popular surgery? Penile Enlargement.
- In Canada in 2006: 1,132, 000 men were solo parents compared to only 281,000 women.
- In 2014, Alexander Shelly [NAC Orchestra] was the first man ever to be Music Director of a major Canadian symphony orchestra. In 2012, 91% of conductors in the 103 highest-budget US orchestras were women, and only 9% were men.

Actually, these statistics are all true if you reverse the sexes.
